My dear Sir.

I did not read the whole of your letter when I saw that my application to you was not agreeable after making all the explanation I could on the subject - I applied elsewhere - but do not suppose that I am angry or offended at your refusal - it was quite natural and the contrary not to be complained of with any justice - therefore I beg you not to trouble yourself more on the subject - if by any means you can procure a sale for Mansbridge it would be rendering me a great service. I would sell it for 22^o per acre 1000 to remain at 0 per cent - 5006 years remainder, bills ~~remain~~ which I would undertake should be renewed for 12 months - my crops seem to get on, but so slowly that
