Jane & I picked raspberries, cherries, & strawberries or desert.

9 SUNDAY - 1st Epiph [9-367]

Fire Insurance ceases

10 MONDAY (10-356)

Fine. Father rode twice to Mayfield & in Batt's run to see carp cutting scrub. Mark went to the former place for cattle, & has had some stray sheep shown. Kate & I got a few strawberries for Mr. Larn & took them to her. Florence & Amy went to the orchard for cherries. Another busy in the garden, she has given Florence two canaries, there were five young birds.

11 TUESDAY (11-355)

Hilary Term begins. 0° 28' A.M.

Fine. Father went to Mayfield. Mr. Sabart came from Madford's for dinner; afterwards he went on with Father to Swansea. Mark has been busy with sheep. Florence, Kate, Amy, & I went picking strawberries & raspberries.

12 WEDNESDAY (12-354)

Fine. Mark started off for Cranbrooke to Mr. Bishop Glyn's sale (who is going to Victoria) when we were at breakfast. Has Garry. Did the flowers. We then & Florence went down on the Reef - never saw the tide out so far. I took off & went to the furthest rock: got mutton fish, cockles, mussels, & winkles.

13 THURSDAY (13-353)

Oxford Lent Term begins

Loss rather cloudy. Jane, Ida, & I picked red currants, away nearly three hours. Father and Mark came home from the sale at Swansea, after dinner. Florence & Amy picked cherries in the orchard - we four went for raspberries for tea. Father bought 5 cattle & a horse for driving. Mr. & Mrs. Thomas Westbrooke drove up late with two pony ponies.

14 FRIDAY (14-352)

Oxford Lent Term begins

Cloudy - Breakfast about 10 o'clock. Mr. & Mrs. drove away for Buckland if "Tommy" & "Sambo" can take them so far. Mark took his dinner out in the Jerry Paddock. Father went to Mayfield in the afternoon - Florence went with Kate, Amy, & me to the garden for cherries.

15 SATURDAY (15-351)

Rain & wind first but cleared off. Mark, Kate, & I set the net, & sailed down the Creek. Helped Kate stone cherries - Amy & I with Florence, picked fruit for desert & were rather late for tea. Mark rode out in the Mayfield sun, & went oppossuning. Father rode to Mayfield. English mail all well.

Warm. Sunday school & church. Mr. Mayson

16 SUNDAY - 2 aft Epiph (16-350)

calm. Mark went to see Glyn & ask for his bruised leg.

17 MONDAY [17-340]

Warm - Father rode to Mayfield. Dr. Mundle came to dinner. Miss Wright is unwell, and Mr Wright's baby is dangerously ill. Kate went to see both Mother and Amy the latter also. Mark has been very busy as usual. Amy went to the garden. Doctor Mundle sounded her chest it is right as yet. Thank God. Mr Mayson left.

18 TUESDAY [18-348]

Fine (?) Dr. Mundle went. Mr Wright's baby is better. Father rode to Mayfield twice. Kate and Mark drove to Swansea, he took a picnic on to Cambria, back to Red Banks & rode home on the new horse (Pickwick) while Kate drove herself home. Florence went to the creek garden with myself, Amy & servants, for cherries & raspberries.

19 WEDNESDAY [19-347]

Rainy morning. Mother intended going for a drive, but the rain deterred us. Mark stopped a gap of fencing at the Ferry Paddock. Took a few sheep to Boomer Creek. Mr Allison left. Amy got a few cherries from the orchard while Kate, Florence & I went for a short pull - let the boy steer. Stoned cherries.

20 THURSDAY [20-346]

Shower afternoon. Father rode to Mayfield twice. Mark rode there too, came home late for dinner. Kate, Amy, & I, picked raspberries, & a few strawberries & got pretty wet. Florence walked up with us. She & I went to this orchard for cherries before dinner. Mother gave Mr Dodge two canaries, which Jane took to her.

21 FRIDAY [21-345]

Heavy showers in the middle of the day. I drove Mother & Florence up to see Miss Wright. Took keys down to Kate & Amy in the creek garden, stayed for a shower, then drove to the Ferry Paddock & were caught in a shower returning. H.A. & Jane got black currants for jam. Mark rode to the Ferry Rd. Father went to Mayfield. The Castello's have gone.

22 SATURDAY [22-344]

Fine, sprinkle of rain. Father rode twice to Mayfield. Mark & Archibald went returning Mayfield sheep early & late. Florence & I drove the new horse (Pickwick) to the Ebbly Bush & Hop-oast (which we went into) - took down the decorations from the school on our return. Miss Wright was not well enough to go. Fine. Father read the Church service in the school. Kate went reading on the beach. Mark was walking.

23 SUNDAY - 3rd Epiph [23-343]

24 MONDAY [24-362]

Fine very. Mark was out early back to breakfast & took his dinner out. Went oppossuming at the Perry Park. We three & Florence went down on the beaches. I played croquet with the latter. Father rode to Mayfield about here. Mark came home at 10 o'clock A.M.

25 TUESDAY [25-341]

Observation of St. Paul

Cloudy - first. Father & Mark went to Mayfield for cattle. She first went twice, the latter took his dinner. Kate, Amy, & two girls picked cherries. Florence & I drove to Lover's Leap, round to and along the long beach; back to the top ground for plaiintain seed and evergreens. Look up the servants from the top of the hill by the garden. Miss Wright called.

26 WEDNESDAY [26-340]

Fine dull afternoon. Father rode to Mayfield. Mark went there. Kate, Amy, & I picked cherries, boy helped. we picked currants off stems. I hoed two flower beds. Florence went to the garden after us. Arranged flowers.

1876 [27-339]

27 THURSDAY [27-339]

Warmest day for some time. Father went to Mayfield. Mark took his dinner out, home for early tea, out oppossuming after. Kate drove Florence home to the Mill with my saddles. Weeded one flower bed, Jane helping me; played croquet with Florence. Hoise enough last night with the cows & calves, two of the latter got in the garden.

28 FRIDAY [28-335]

Warm. Harriet Mayson & Amy Shaw took up in the morning. D. Mandle came, with them after staying at Mayfield &ools came on. He, Kate, Florence & I played two games of croquet. Mark, Harriet, & two Amys, another game at the same time. After tea Mark went to Mayfield. Harriet & I went down on the reef. Father went to Mayfield.

29 SATURDAY [29-337]

~~Harriet Mayson & Amy Shaw took up in the morning. D. Mandle came, with them after staying at Mayfield &ools came on. He, Kate, Florence & I played two games of croquet. Mark, Harriet, & two Amys, another game at the same time. After tea Mark went to Mayfield. Harriet & I went down on the reef. Father went to Mayfield.~~
 Fine. Went to the Sunday school & waited in vain for Mr. Mayson & some of us paid a visit to the gardens. Harriet & I to home through the orchard for Mulberries.

30 SUNDAY - 4 aft Epiph [30-336]

Hilary Term ends

Fine - Father & Mark took cattle to Grayfield; the latter went again. I drove Harriet & Florence to Grayfield Scrub, Harriet drove back & bent the step against the gate post. The Kate went on the beach.

1 Feb TUESDAY [92-334]

Partridge and Pheasant shooting ends

Fine - Father and Harriet, rode off to Swansea - Amy & I took Jane to help us pick raspberries, the last I think - & got a few strawberries. We did some gardening. Kate drove Florence to the mill & brought back my saddles. Mark made a figure of four trap.

2 WEDNESDAY [93-333]

Purification of V.M. Candlemas

Fine - Father returned after dinner with Mr Shaw. Mark tried mowing his oats, but did not manage well - had the boy too. I drove Florence looking for gum near Minshall's snowhill: back late for tea. Amy & I did some gardening. Mother is not well. Father sent & received the first telegraphic message to Robert Down. He sent one for me to Miss Gilt.

3 THURSDAY [94-332]

53rd A.M.

Fine. Dull at first. We started off after breakfast. Some Swansea people at Newark picnic at Gotherwold. Kate drove Mark & I rode & were there late. Mr Shaw, Mr Parlee, Mary Meredith & Harriet Mayson rode up to the picnic. After lunch, Kate myself & Harriet & I rode & Mark walked off to the mill & had long tramp. Met Mr Shaw & Father coming who stayed at the

4 FRIDAY [95-331]

Fine. Father rode to Grayfield twice. Mary Meredith & Harriet Mayson went. Kate drove Florence part way with them, & I rode on to the station with Harriet, left her on the road with Mary & returned with Father - we drove out a lot of calves from Grayfield, called at the mill & home. Mark & two men went off to seaford late in the boat but returned when half across. Florence Irvine & I played a game of croquet with 2 balls - she won.

5 SATURDAY [96-330]

Warm. I drove Florence Irvine to Swansea & Mark rode up to Doctor's house & drove me back after having tea at the house. Mr Shaw & Mr Parlee to be met at the boat. Mark went on to Swansea where I went over to Cambria & the mill. Some business & I drove home.

6 SUNDAY [97-329]

Fine fog. Sunday school & Church. Amy & I got some mulberries. Mother is no better.

7 MONDAY [35-328]

Fine. Father rode twice to Mayfield. I went with him once, over to Christmas Island, got a big snake killed in the large field this side. Gave Horrel my reign to mend. Mother seems better.

8 TUESDAY [39-327]

Half Quarter Day

Cloudy rather. Father rode twice to Mayfield. I drove Kate to the mill with my saddles in the morning and went for them in the evening with Miss Wright, & her little maid. Had to go over to Mr. Minshall's for the key from Horrel. Mark & Wright have been mowing the oats at the Ferry Rd. Turkey brought out seven little

9 WEDNESDAY [40-326]

O 5:47 P.M.

rather dull. Mark has been busy binding his oats. Father rode twice to Mayfield, & Batt's run. Scotty has been doing up Mother's garden, carting sand. Amy & I did a little gardening. put up 23 chicks from the garden. Kate pulled herself in the boat.

10 THURSDAY [41-325]

Fine. Father rode twice to Mayfield. I went with him once, round to the scrub & Beach Creek. Kate went on the beach. Amy picked mulberries & did gardening. Mark has been busy at the Ferry Paddock with his oats. Scotty got two loads of gravel for the paths.

11 FRIDAY [42-324]

Fine. Father rode to Mayfield & out in Batt's run. Mark has been busy at the Ferry Paddock. Amy did gardening. Kate went in the boat with the boy. Wrote part way letter to Winnie. Scotty finished gravelling the paths.

12 SATURDAY [43-323]

Fine. Mark has been busy with his oats. Father rode twice to Mayfield. I went the second time with him. Taylor brought over a beautiful bunch of flowers. Kate went on the beach, & with Amy for fruit to the garden. I went with Mark & went to the saltworks. We in the boat, back by the road, having a great deal of brambles above. The horse came. The wire gamblers were christened in the house Mr. Johnston.

14 MONDAY (46-391)

St. Valentine

Fine. Father rode twice to Mayfield. Mark went there with cattle. Kate went on the beach. Amy helped me pick some mulberries for Harriet, who is laid up with a sore knee. Mr. Mayson took them. Wrote to Min & Aunt Sarah.

15 TUESDAY (46-392)

Fine. Slight sunshine. Mark took his dinner out in the Mayfield run. Kate went to Mayfield, had the water turned over the kops. in the afternoon I went about there & in Batt's run on Shilly Hill. Kate & Amy went to the gardens, got peaches, blackberries, & plums.

16 WEDNESDAY (47-319)

Fine. As I was getting ready to go with Father to Swanter, a boy came saying Mrs. Minchall was found dead in the bed this morning!! He was quite well yesterday but took a bad cold. We went there on our way. Father ordered a coffin at Swanter. Our shoes were shod. I went to the bank. Father went before me to the bank at Swanter. I went into the shop with Margaret & Emily, Mayson.

17 THURSDAY (46-315)

St. Valentine

Fine - Father went out in Batt's run. After 12 o'clock dinner he & Mark went to attend the inquest on poor Mr. Minchall, & took sandwiches for the jury. Dr. Huddle came here late with Father & Mark, Mr. Mayson, & Mr. Shaw & Co. went to Swanter. Kate took Ida & the boy out in the boat. Mother is a little better. Jane went to the funeral. Miss Wright called.

18 FRIDAY (49-317)

Fine. I got the dinner while Dr. Huddle drove Kate & Amy to see Mr. Parry's baby & Mr. Gumbel's twin child at Mr. Popham. After dinner he went home: rode with Father & I to the Holly Bush. We went down by Look's Leap. Mark went to the Army Paddock, but came home for dinner. Sarah & Kelly, Suttrel were here too. Father went to Mayfield in the morning.

19 SATURDAY (50-316)

Fine - Father rode twice to Mayfield. Mark & Amy finished stacking his oats at the Army Paddock. Kate spent about two hours on the beach, & went with Amy for fruit for tomorrow's desert. I drove Miss Wright & her maid to Hadford & back. George Gray fell & hurt one of his fingers getting the Post.

Fine. Sunday School & Church.

Wrote to Frank. Miss Wright came to tea & spent the evening.

20 Sexagesima SUNDAY (51-316)

31 MONDAY [52-314]

Rained a little before breakfast - rather dull. S. breeze. Miss Wright went on board the "Tennis" enroute for Hobart Town for a holiday. Mark & Father took pigs to Mayfield. The latter went again - former went to Penguin after tea. Kate went on the beach. Parcels from the vessel this diary for one thing. Amy went with me from six A.M. to seven o'clock for day trees to send to Mr. Giblin soon.

22 TUESDAY [53-313]

Dull - Father & I rode off for Spring Bay looking for hop pickers, intending staying the night at Kootvor but George Mace had gone to the races. We went on to Oxford & lunched with, or at, Mr. Charles Meredith's then went on to Woodside. Mr. Wallace Grant is living here. Mr. Johnson, Miss Manning, & another girl were here to tea.

23 WEDNESDAY [54-312]

Fine & warm. We started for home at ten, & did not get home till about 1 o'clock. I did not get off all day, felt rather green after I had for a little. Mark has been riding Pickwick today. Letter from Miss - & Aunt. Frank wrote to Mother.

1876 29 1877

24 THURSDAY [55-311]

St. Martin's, Cambridge Tent Term
at 10:30 A.M.

Fine. Father rode to Mayfield twice. He met Mr. Graham and his boy Vincent at Trehawk - manging for the sale of the stock. They came on here to dinner. Mark took his out only returning to tea, out again. Kate went down on the beach. Amy watered Mother's flowers. Jane Kotton was sent home to tell her mother about hop picking. Strong N.W. wind.

25 FRIDAY [56-310]

Father went twice to Mayfield. Dr. Kundle, & Mr. Karlee, came to dinner & went away again after. Mark went to Hadfords & about - home for dinner - Kate gave me the housekeeping again yesterday. They went to Spring Bay for hop pickers.

26 SATURDAY [57-309]

Fine, cloudy towards night. Father rode to Mayfield & in the morn. Mark drove Kate for Swansea, in afternoon enroute for Avoca on Monday. she wants to go over from Lynncaston to Victoria, Knight with Mr. Dristow. Amy & I have been very busy all day. Heavy rain in the night shower this morn. Feol at Sunday School. Mr. Mayson came. Practised after church as usual. Did the Post.

27 Quinquagesima SUNDAY [58-308]

More Hunting ends

28 MONDAY [30-307]

Beautiful day.
 Father went twice to Mayfield to see the hop picking which begins today. Grey went yesterday & brought the second cart of pickers from Spring Bay today. I went with Father in the afternoon. Picked a few hops, drove back some calves, & went to the scrub hop ground, there is a very good crop of hops. Mr Mayson left.

29 Shrove TUESDAY [60-308]

Fine.
 Father went to Mayfield, twice. Amy & I, rode with him once. tied our horses & walked over to look at the hop picking - talked to Holly, Jane Anne, & Achard. Drove a cow before us from the Foundation field home. Sent the boy to the hop picking intend doing so most days.

1 March Ash WEDNESDAY [61-305]

St. David's Day. Fly Fishing begins

Fine. Father went twice to the hop picking. Mark came home from Avoa leaving Kate on the break. He came from the Spring Dale this morning. Got the cows home that had run away. Amy got a flower for Mother from the land bank. Anne & Ida went to the hops in the afternoon.
 Amy Shaw is engaged to Mr Barber.

2 THURSDAY [62-304]

Fine. Father came home late for dinner with Mr Graham & his boy Vincent, who stayed till nearly 5 o'clock A.M. Mark went to Mayfield, & mended a gap at Boag's.

3 FRIDAY [63-303]

9^h 45^m A.M.

Been very fine again.
 Father rode twice to Mayfield. I went once - we put 31 cattle into the beach field, & there are 100 pigs there too. Mark has had Grey at the Jerry Maddocks. Servants went to the hop ground in the afternoon.

4 SATURDAY [64-302]

Fine. Father rode to Mayfield, home quickly, because he wanted these men to burn charcoal for the hop drying. Mark has been riding out at the back. Amy watered Mother's flowers. Jesse & the boy went for bony pears, only got three!
 Fine. Mark went reading on the back. Sunday school & Father read the service.

5 SUNDAY - 1st in Lent [65-301]
Easter Week

6 MONDAY [66-300]

Fine. Father went twice to the hop ground & Mayfield. Mark has had the boy riding after sheep, home to dinner.

7 TUESDAY [67-299]

Shower in the night warm & close. Father went to the hop picking twice. Mark has had the boy riding about after sheep, home to dinner though. Amy did gardening; read aloud to us. We have been busy; as usual.

8 WEDNESDAY [68-298]

Cloudy, & threatening. Father went to Prekawk to meet Mr Graham, who is winding up affairs there. On to Mayfield. Mark & the boy have been busy in the sheep yards. Amy got some figs, & read aloud to us.

1876 31 Day

9 to 12 March

9 THURSDAY [69-297]

Cloudy, damp, little rain in the night. Father & Mark rode off to Swansea to attend the sale there & at home. Scarlet fever is at Mr. Jones close to the road. Scotty has been carting earth into the garden. Amy & I went with the boy in the boat. He broke a sparrow hawk's leg that had killed a pigeon.

10 FRIDAY [70-296]

Eclipse of the Moon
Ember Day. 5^h 12^m 4^h 30^m

Fine. Father rode twice to Mayfield. Mark returned at bedtime leaving his sheep - 101 - at Mayfield. Out again for fat sheep. Scotty worked in Mother's garden. Jane & I picked mulberries for jam.

11 SATURDAY [71-295]

Ember Day

Fine. Drizzled a little. Mark rode about all day. Amy & I went with the boy to pig's home. Amy & I have been very busy preparing for the Governor's dinner. Before tea went to the garden for peaches.
