Fine, rather cloudy. Jane, Ira, & I picked red currants, away nearly three hours. Father and Mark came home from the sale or Swansea, after dinner. Florence & Amy picked cherries in the orchard. we four went for raspberries for tea. Father bought 6 cattle & a horse for driving. Mr. & Mrs. Thomas Whitbrooke drove up late with two tiny ponies.

14 FRIDAY [14-352]

Oxford Lent Term begins

Fine. Breakfast about 6 o'clock. Mr. & Mrs. drove away for Buckland if "Tommy" & "Lambo" can take them so far. Mark took his dinner out in the Ferry Paddock. Father went to Mayfield in the afternoon. Florence went with Kate, Amy & me to the gardens for cherries.

15 SATURDAY [15-351]

Rain, & wind first but cleared off. Mark, Kate, & I set the net, & sailed down the creek. Helped Kate stone cherries. Amy & I with Florence, picked fruit for dessert & were rather late for tea. Mark rode out in the Mayfield sans, & went opossuming. Father rode to Mayfield. English mail all well.

Warm. Sunday school & church. Mr. Mayson came. Mark went to see Guy & ask for his bruised leg.

16 SUNDAY - Last Epiphany [16-350]

17 MONDAY [21-346]

Warm - Father rode to Mayfield. Dr. Hyndle came to dinner. Miss Wright is unwell, and Mr. Wright's baby is dangerous ill. Kate went to see both Mother and Amy the latter also. Mark has been very busy as usual. Amy went to the gardens. Doctor Park attended his chest it is right as yet. Thank God. Mr. Mayson left.

18 TUESDAY [18-318]

Fine (2) Dr. Hyndle went. Mr. Wright's baby is better. Father rode to Mayfield twice. Kate and Mark drove to Yarneea, he took carriage on to Cumbria, back to Red Banks & rode home on the new horse Pickwick while Kate drove herself home. Florence went to the Greek garden with myself Amy & servants, for cherries & raspberries.

19 WEDNESDAY [19-347]

Rainy morning. Mother intended going for a drive, but the rain ~~detained~~ us. Mark stopped a gap of driving at the Ferry Paddock. Took a few sheep to Bonner Creek. Mr. Allison left. Amy got a few cherries from the orchard while Kate, Florence & I went for a short pull - let the boy steer stoned cherries.

1876 31 DAYS

20 THURSDAY [20-346]

Father rode to Mayfield twice. Mark rode there too, came home late for dinner. Kate, Amy, & I, picked raspberries, & a few strawberries. Got pretty wet. Florence walked up with us. She & I went to this orchard for cherries before dinner. Mother gave Mr. Dodge two canaries, which Jane took to her.

21 FRIDAY [21-315]

Heavy showers in the middle of the day. I drove Mother & Florence up to see Miss Wright, took her down to Kate & Amy in the Greek garden, stayed for a shower, then drove to the Ferry Paddock & were caught in a shower returning. H.A. & Jane got black currants for jam. Mark rode to the Ferry Rd. Father went to Mayfield. The Costello's have gone.

22 SATURDAY [22-341]

Fine, sprinkle of rain. Father rode twice to Mayfield. Mark & Arthur went gathering Mayfield sheep early & late. Florence & I rode the new horse Pickwick to the Holly Bush & Hopwart (which we went into) - took down the decorations from the school on our return. Miss Wright was not well enough to go.

Fine - Father read the church service in the school. Kate went reading walking.

23 SUNDAY - 3 aft Epiph [23-343]

24 MONDAY [21-342] Fine very. Mark was
out early back to breakfast
& took this dinner out. Went
oppossuming at the Ferry Park.
We three & Florence went
down on the beaches. I played
croquet with the latter.
Father rode to Mayfield & about
here. Mark came home at
10 o'clock A. M.

25 TUESDAY [25-34]
Conversation of St. Paul
Cloudy first. Father
& Mark went to Mayfield for cattle.
The first went twice, the latter took
his dinner. Kate, Amy, & two girls
picked cherries. Florence, & I drove

Fine dull afternoon
Father rode to Mayfield. Mark
went there. Kate, Amy, & I
picked cherries, so I helped. We
picked currants off stems.
I hoed two flower beds. Florence
went to the gardens after us.
Arranged flowers.

ON THURSDAY [7-19]

WARMEST day for some time.
Father went to Mayfield. Mark
took his dinner out, home for
early tea, out of possession after.
Late drove Gloucester to the Mill
with my saddles. Weeded one
flower bed you helping me; played
croquet with Florence, Noisie
enough last night with the cows
& calves, two of the latter got in the garden.

28 FRIDAY [28-435] Warm. Harriet Mayson & Amy Shaw rode up in the morning. Dr. Whipple came with them after staying at Mayfield & Pools came on. He, Kate, Florence & I played two games of croquet. Harriet, & two Amys another game at the same time. After tea Harriet went to Mayfield. Harriet & I went down on the reef. Father went to Mayfield.

29 SATURDAY [29-337] ~~Marion County Schools & Library~~
Spent till tea time - I was very
tired & walked to the head of the
creek, down where the stream flows
from the State border & sat at a
spot where the water was shallow.
Later we went to the
red house & I had a talk with
the man there. Then all the girls took

8 THURSDAY [34-336]

11.53 A.M.

Fine - Kate started off after breakfast
alone to see people at Rehauk
I drove Jane & other girls. Kate drove
Mark to Brode & were there late.
Amy, Harriet & I rode, Mr Barley, Mary Meredith
& our son came up to the picnic
with us. Left Hugh, Kate myself &
Mark walked off to the sea mill a long tump. Met Mr
Shaw & Father Connors who stayed at the

4 FRIDAY [35-337]

Fine. Father rode to Mayfield
twice. Mary Meredith & Harriet Mayson went.
Kate drove Florence part way with them, & rode
on to the station with Harriet, left her on the

Cloudy rather. Father rode twice to Mayfield. I drove Agte to the mill with my saddles in the morning and went for them in the evening with Miss Wright & her little maid. Had to go over to Mr. Minshall's for the key from Horrel. Mark & Wright have been mowing the oats at the Ferry Rd. Issak brought out seven lbs.

9 WEDNESDAY [40-326]

3 P.M. 47° F.R.

Mather full. Mark has been busy binding his oats. Father rode twice to Mayfield & Batt's run. Scotty has been doing up Mother's garden, carting sand. Amy & I did a little gardening. Put up 23 chicks from the garden. Kate pulled herself in the boat.

1876 29 Days

[10 to 12] February

10 THURSDAY [41-325]

Fine - Father rode twice to Mayfield, I went with him once round to the scrub & Beach trip. Kate went on the beach. Amy picked mulberries & did gardening. Mark has been busy at the Ferry Paddock with his oats. Scotty got two loads of gravel for the paths.

11 FRIDAY [42-324]

Fine Father rode to Mayfield & out in Batt's run. Mark has been busy at the Ferry Paddock. Amy did gardening. Agte went in the boat with the boy. Wrote part way letter to Mirrie. Scotty finished graveling the paths.

12 SATURDAY [43-323]

Fine. Mark has been busy with with his oats. Father rode twice to Mayfield. I went the second time with him. Taylor brought over a beautiful bunch of flowers. Kate went on the back, & with Amy for first to the gardens.

13 SUNDAY [44-322]

Mark went to the saltworks to see Leader back by the road having a fine bed of brambles above the garden. Mr. Weston came. The brambles are cleared. Mr. Hyde has one Mr. Johnston

February 14 to 16

2d Month 1876

[17 to 20] February

14 MONDAY [14-321]

St. Valentine

Fine. Father rode twice to Mayfield. Mark went there with cattle. Kate went on the beach. Amy helped me pick some mulberries for Harriet, who is laid up with a sore knee. Mr Mayson took them. Wrote to Min & Aunt Sarah.

15 TUESDAY [14-320]

Fine. Slight sunshine then Mark took his dinner out in the Mayfield runs. Father went to Mayfield, had the water turned over the hops. in the afternoon I went about there & in Batt's run on Shelly Hill. Kate & Am went to the gardens, got peaches, blackberries, & plums.

16 WEDNESDAY [15-319]

Fine. As I was getting ready to go with Father to Gardner a boy came saying Mr. Ninehall was found dead to be dead this morning!! He was sick yesterday but took medicine. We went there on our way. Patty ordered a coffin at Cawood. The horses were shod. I took ship to Ted Banks. Father went before me to the General Hospital. I went into the Telegraph Office with Margaret & Emily Mayson.

1876 12 Days

17 THURSDAY [15-315]
C 45 25th 24th

Fine - Father went out in Batt's run. After 12 o'clock dinner he & Mark went to attend the inquest on poor Mr Ninehall, & took sandwiches for the jury. Dr Hundle came here late with Father & Mark, Mr Mayson, & Mr Shaw &c, went to Swansea. Late took Ida & the boy out in the boat. Mother is a little better. Jane went to the funeral. Miss Wright called.

18 FRIDAY [15-317]

Fine. I got the dinner while Dr Hundle drove Kate & Amy to see Mr Parry's baby, & Mr Gumbel's stillborn child at Mr Phelps. After dinner he went home: took with Father & I to the Holly Bush. We went down by Lover's Leap. Mark went to the Long Paddock, but came home for dinner. Sarah & Nelly Settel were here too. Father went to Mayfield in the morning.

19 SATURDAY [16-316]

Fine - Father rode twice to Mayfield. Mark & men finished stacking his oats at the Long Paddock. Kate spent about two hours on that beach, & went with Amy for fruit for tomorrow's dessert. I drove Miss Wright & her maid to Hadfords & back. George Gray fell & hurt one of his fingers getting the Post.

Fine. Sunday School & Church. Wrote to Frank. Miss Wright came to tea & spent the evening.

20 Sexagesima SUNDAY [16-316]

February [21 to 23]

2d month 1876

21 MONDAY [52-314] Played a little before breakfast - rather dull. I breezy. Miss Wright went on board the "Dawn" enroute for Hobart Town for a holiday. Mark & Father took pigs to Mayfield. the latter went again - former went to Penquite after tea. Kate went on the beach. Parcels from the vessel this diary for one thing. Amy went with me from six A.M. to seven o'clock for laundry to send to Mr. Giblin soon.

22 TUESDAY [53-315] Dull. Father & I rode off for Spring Bay looking for hop pickers, intending staying the night at Newtrevor but George Mare had gone to the races. We went on to Oxford & lunched with, or at, Mr. Charles Meredith; then went up to Woodeden. Mr. Wallace Grant is living here. Mr. & Mrs. Mannering, & another girl were here to tea.

23 WEDNESDAY [54-316] Fine & warm. We started for home at ten, & did not get home till about 10 o'clock. I did not get off all day felt rather queer after I had for a little. Mark has been riding Pickwick today. Letter from Miss & Aunt Frank wrote to Mother.

[24 to 27] February

24 THURSDAY [55-317]
St. Matthew's, Cambridge Lent Term
(10:30 AM at midday)

Fine. Father rode to Mayfield twice. He met Mr. Graham and his boy Vincent at Treherne. Waiting for the sale of the stock. They came over here to dinner. Mark took his out only returning to tea out again. Kate went down on the beach. Amy watered Mother's flowers. Jane Bottom was sent home to tell her mother about hop picking.

25 FRIDAY [56-318]

Strong N.W. wind. Father went twice to Mayfield. Dr. Knudle, & Mr. Barlee, came to dinner & went away again after. Mark went to Radfords & about home for dinner. Kate gave me the housekeeping again yesterday. Guy went to Spring Bay for hop pickers.

26 SATURDAY [57-319]

Fine. Cloudy towards night. Father rode to Mayfield & in the suns. Mark drove Kate for Swansea, in afternoon enroute for Avoca on Monday. she wants to go over from Lyndleton to Victoria, eight with Mr. Bristol. Amy & I have been very busy all day.

Heavy rain in the night shower this eve. Poet at Sunday School. Mr. Mayson came. Practised after church musical. Did the Poet.

Hare Hunting ends

28 MONDAY [29-307]

Beautiful day.
 Father went twice to Mayfield
 to see the hop picking which
 begins today. Grey went yesterday
 & brought the second cart

 Picked a few hops, drove back
 some calves, & went to the
 scrub Hop ground, there is a very
 good crop of hops. Mr Mayson left.

Father went to Mayfield, twice.
 Amy & I, rode with him once.
 tied our horses & walked over
 to look at the Hop picking -
 talked to Hobley, Ann Anne, & Dickie.
 Drove a cow before us from

 Sent the boy to the hop picking

8 WEDNESDAY [68-298]
Ember Day

Cloudy, & threatening. Father went to Frensham to meet Mr Graham, who is winding up affairs there. On to Mayfield. Mark & the boy have been busy in the sheep yards. Amy got some fics, & read aloud to us.

1876 31 Days

9 THURSDAY [69-297]

Cloudy, damp little rain in the night. Father rode off to Swansea to attend the sale there & at noon. Scarlet fever is at Mayfield. Scarlet fever is at Mayfield close to the road.
