1 WEDNESDAY [1-104] Thursday 1-1-1874

Warm day. Papa rode twice to Mayfield. Mark rode out to a deep valley and did some bush burning. Kate and Miss Dove drove, Amy, rode to Mayfield after tea. They brought home some bacon for me from the Mill. Mr. Meredith, and Ernest called for tea on their way home from Town. They went on to Swansea afterwards. Kate & I went for vegetables and fruit after breakfast. Mr. Whight is papering the passage and has done the dining room. Begun my letter to ^{Opposition. See newspaper. A. D.} Minnie Quiller. Mark has been trying trifles in the east.

FRIDAY [2-362]

Warm, and hazy. Mark has been out burning. Papa rode twice to Mayfield. I went for peas, & gooseberries for my two Sibans, to the Creek garden. Kate went afterwards for fruit. She and Miss Dove drove to Pentipool in the evening to see the Gambols, & Balford's junior. Amy went for a short walk in the Home paddock after tea.

3 FRIDAY [2-362]

Saturday

Cloudy. Papa rode twice to Mayfield. Mark went out burning, took his dinner. Mr W. J. Syre came, talked to us some time, then went away, met Papa on his way home again. Kate, and I, went to the Creek garden for peas, and gooseberries. After tea Amy went there, as Miss Dove, & Kate, came away, with some strawberries. I went with the two last named for a short walk. Poor old Mark went out to the fires again after tea.

V. 1861-1862 [4-361]

Sunday

Cloudy. Mr Mayson preached. Mark did not return from his fires until daylight, got up as we were going to the Sunday school, after taking dinner, went out to look at his fires. Amy went to the Creek garden.

Monday

Showery in the first thing. Mr Mayson drove to Mayfield, bought June Ann's horse, after dinner drove Miss Dove away. Papa rode to Mayfield, and Kate down to see the men cutting down scrub. Mark went round his mines.

Tuesday

Cloudy and Amy went for butter, called to see Mr Buckley. I got peas and peat for Kangaroo.

6 MONDAY [6-259] [†] Tuesday

Fine. Papa rode to Mayfield ^{Trinity}.
 Mark went out all day. Home to tea. Kate,
 and Amy went to pick fruit. Mr Shaw,
 Mr Shew, and Miss Pope, drove home to tea.
 Papa also went out in the suns.

7 TUESDAY [7-260] Wednesday

Warm. Mr Shaw drove Papa to Mayfield.
 Mark had breakfast before us, went
 burning. Kate, and Amy drove in Mr Shew's
 vehicle for butter for tea to Mr Marshall.
 Amy got quit for breakfast, and Kate got
 some gooseberries for dinner. They both went
 after tea. Finished a pint does (making).
 Jones, & I, pulled my saddle to pieces because
 the tree is broken. Mark got sick for breakfast
 this evening.

8 WEDNESDAY [8-261] Thursday

Fine little windy. Papa rode to Mayfield in
 the afternoon. Mark got some beans for
 Mr Shew to take home. They went away with
 the intention of dining at Kelvindon. Amy
 drove Miss Pope in the gig because she meant
 to drive Miss Jones back from Swansea.
 We three went to the creek garden before
 breakfast. Kate and I went again after tea.

9 THURSDAY [12-184] Friday

Warm but cool winds. Papa rode Job Trotter today to Mayfield because Lynn has a sore back. Mark has been hunting with Ben. Borrowed the Sykes spring chest and has been driving Faithful about to break it in for sale. Kate and I went to Mr. Ninehills saw Mr. George, to speak to for the first time. I turned Garry Brownie and Anna over to Rogers, afterwards. Dr. Story went to see Mr. Buckley, he is better.

10 FRIDAY [13-184]

Saturday

Fine. Papa rode to Mayfield in the morning. Guiding Star called for the bacon. Kate and I picked fruit before tea - after walked to Mr. Ninehills gate. Mark has been riding out in the suns. brought me another hangover. Drove Faithful in the vehicle to Roberts'. We called at River View. Mr. Buckley is much better. Heard from Minnie.

11 SATURDAY [13-184]

Sunday

Fine. Mark went to the fires near Barns and helped them put it out.

12 Monday

Cloudy few drops of rain. Amy drove home with her friend Miss H. Jones to dinner from Red Banks. Mark has been out in the suns late picked some raspberries. She, Miss May and I, went down the Creek in the boat then along the Point beach. Amy went to bed early because she has toothache very badly.

12 MONDAY [15-351]

Tuesday

Rained softly all night and this morning Amy's toothache is better but she has had a very bad headache lying on the sofa. Kate, Miss Jones, and I went to the garden for fruit after dinner. Henry Meredith came to tea. Papa rode to Mayfield. Mark has been home to meal.

14 TUESDAY [15-351]

Wednesday

Cloudy first but fine day. Henry, Meredith, Mark, Kate, Miss Jones, & I went round in the boat, into Little Swanport river, landed for a short time on the bank while we girls went to Mr. Pattenbury for five young and one old turkey; now our return in the evening got them Henry kindly coming to carry them down to the boat for us. The boys got some cockles for dinner then had a nice sail up to the higher side of Hadfields Bridge or ~~Hadfield~~ Little Swanport. Dined there, on our return, Mark shot at a Pelican, and some Ring-bills. He and Henry pulled us home again back about eight o'clock. We got out in the water several times. Mr. Marshall ^{swimming} sent us.

15 Thursday

Fine. Papa rode to Mayfield in the morning. Mark and Henry went for a drive with Faithful. They rode to Mayfield beach bush for fat sheep and cattle. Amy drove Miss Jones to Picnic Valley. I rode with Mark and Henry to the Mill, left them, went along the ^{+ 13} fence over ~~the~~ fence on to the road which the big ^{old} Mr. Marshall on my return sent some raspberries. Miss Jones Amy, kept Kate pick some raspberries when they came home.

16 TUESDAY (16-342) Friday

Fine. Papa rode to Mayfield twice.
 Late got Henry, and Mark breakfast early, then they started with six fat cattle that Mark is driving to the Richmond sale next Tuesday. He has taken Faithful also. Henry helped him on the road past Haunsdale returned just late for dinner. Dr. Story dined here. Mr. Bushell is better. Late drove Miss Jones, Henry, and Amy rode to Mayfield beaches for shells. I got some grass for my kangaroo from the gardens then made some cakes for tea.

17 FRIDAY (17-343) Saturday

Fine. Henry got some gooseberries for us after dinner, then wished us good bye for ten years he says. He is to start from Hobart Town on Tuesday for New Zealand. Papa rode to Mayfield in the afternoon. John Wye drove Miss Smith and Amy Shaw home dinner time. Late, and I, took them in the boat for a row. Miss Jones, and Amy went to the gardens instead.

18 SATURDAY (18-344) Sunday

Fine. Kate went for fruit for dessert. Amy and Miss Smith went on the beach. All went to Sunday School and church. Mr. Mayson came.

19 Monday

Fine. Papa rode twice to Mayfield. We six girls have been at Mayfield picnicking at the Deep Ground, were weighed at the mill. Then went down on the beach by Christmas Island. Amy Shaw and Kate walked home from there, but we went on to Lover's Leap. Only had the gig, Amy, and I left Pronnie, & carry up and left them. Miss Smith walked home, and Miss Jones there. Plump sister & I, drove half the way home in turns.

20 SUNDAY (20-345) Mr. Mayson left. Weights Kate 61 lbs., Amy 101st., Amy Shaw 91st. 5 lbs., Miss Jones 81st. 6 lbs., Miss Smith 81st. Myself 91st. 7 lbs.

20 MONDAY [20-21]

Tuesday

Fine. Papa rode twice to Mayfield once. He started fishing ~~in the~~ ^{in the} of creek at twelve o'clock. Kate came up after us with eatables, then we had our dinner under the bridge. tried to catch trout till it was time to come home to tea. I ordered a pair of boots at the Shoemakers. tried to catch a cream but did not. Miss Jones, Miss Smith and I, ran down on the beach late.

21 TUESDAY [20-21]

Wednesday

Cold morning till abt 9 o'clock when a sea breeze set in. Miss Smith, and I, got some milk, from the other side of the Foundation field. Miss Smith and Amy Shaw drove to Kelvindon, to meet their people. Billy Harris went from the Hop Cottages & drove home the gig. Kate and I, walked to Rocky Hills Beach with them, and got the butter from Mr. Munday. Miss Jones, and Amy, went with the gig to Hornet's Valley. They walk up the road after tea. Mark came home in time to see & hear the girls play for a few minutes before they left. sold *Faithful* for £10.⁰⁰

22 WEDNESDAY [20-21]

Thursday

Fine, breezy. Papa rode to see White, and to Mayfield. Mark went out all day in the sun. Miss Jones and Amy went to the gardens, went on the Sandbank first. Kate too. Then she and I picked mulberries for tea. Amy & I have begun a receipt for making our hair grow. Kate began a week ago; it is to be trial for six months. Took my swans for a swim in the front field pond. They have been cutting the barley out of that field. A Negro had some dinner, he ⁺²⁵ intended to have an entertainment here. Name Blakely Coulthurst. We four went to have him with Mark at Mayfield Highgate.

23 THURSDAY [23-24] Friday

Fine. Finished cutting the barley out of the front field. Papa rode twice to Mayfield. Mark was there too, took out his dinner. Amy went to the gardens in the afternoon. Miss Jones played and sang for us after tea, then I picked some flowers.

24 FRIDAY [24-25] Saturday

Fine. Papa rode to Mayfield. Mark has been out cutting his barley at the Penny Paddock. Amy went for a walk before breakfast, after for evergreens for the vase which she has taken off my hands for the time. Kate, and I, walked to Mayfield to see Mr. Jones. Amy drove up with Miss Jones, then Kate drove her back, while Amy and I, got our horses from the beach bush & brought them home. Amy took her saddle & mine to the mill to be mended. Kate, & Miss Jones went for the post.

25 SATURDAY [25-26] Sunday

Fine. Kate, and Mark went for a walk on the beaches. After church we got some mulberries in the orchard.

26 Monday

Fine. Papa rode twice to Mayfield. Mark has been cutting his barley at the Penny Paddock. Lizzie and I, picked some peas for dinner. Elmyby went for a short walk with Miss Jones along the Penny Paddock track. Kate and I, went further home quickly through the orchard for some mulberries. Played our first - 26 SUNDAY - 2nd Epiphany [26-27] game of croquet this year. Jones says I must say 'Elmyby is a naughty boy'.

27 THURSDAY (27-30)

Tuesday

Fine - warm. Papa to Mayfield. Mark & Ben have been cutting barley at the Tenny Paddock. After tea, Miss Jones, and I, Harriet, Kate, and Amy walked. Mark rode to the Hop-oast, to hear the Negro's entertainment. Hackett Guildhurst, got home at a quarter to eleven. found Mama had made some soup for us before going to bed. Liked it better than the Swansea congee we got £3.12s three shillings less than at Swansea.

28 THURSDAY (28-30)

Wednesday

Sea breeze. Papa rode to Mayfield in the afternoon, wrote letters in the morning. Mark has finished his barley. Kate and Amy went for butter. Harriet, Jones, & I, went to the Creek, and Granks gardens, got food for the Kangaroo, and a basket of possums.

29 THURSDAY (29-30)

Thursday

Fine. Papa rode twice to Mayfield. Mark and Scotty have been putting the corn in heaps at the Tenny Paddock. Kate went to see how Mary Buckley's finger was that she broke last Sunday. Amy went for green shrubs in the bush and for mulberries. I turned Perry, Brownie, and Lynn into the puddle Paddock. Harriet, & I, went with Mark to set the net, got three whilst setting it, rowed down to the boat house up again and got nine more. He gave eight three here + 31. 14s. Total £2. 12s. 6d. Feb 2. 1873. J. M. G. D.

20 THURSDAY [28-29]

Saturday

Been rather windy. Papa rode to Mayfield. Mark, and Ben, have been looking for sheep. Blump went for a walk before breakfast. She and I took the clothes basket to the orchard the other side of the Creek, after tea, and filled it with quince-johns. Mark brought the boat up for them, so we rowed down in moonlight. Kate and Harriet played croquet. The latter and I, went with Mark to take up the net after breakfast, found fifteen nice beans in it, rowed down, and sailed up to ~~21-FRIDAY [29-30]~~ Ted's garden again where we left the boat.

21 Saturday

Windy. Papa rode to Mayfield to see the fires in the runs in the afternoon. Mark took Ben, and they have been at the fires at the back of Mayfield home to one o'clock. Kate, and Amy, went to Mr. Minshall's before tea. Harriet, and I, went to the second beach.

1 Feb SATURDAY [29-30]

Sunday

Mr. Mayson came and preached. Mark got up for late breakfast, then rode to the fires again until after tea time.

2 MONDAY

Fine cool breeze. Papa rode twice to Mayfield.

Mr. Mayson has gone home. He took Kate's old saddle to the mill for me. Amy, and I, went to see Tom about my saddle, at the Holly Bush - started at five minutes to eleven o'clock, and were home at half past one. Mark, and Ben besides Mayfield men have been out at the fires all day. ~~2-FRIDAY [29-30]~~ Played croquet after tea. John Irke brought a letter from Lawrence to Papa.

3 MONDAY [Feb 12] Tuesday

Wool wind. Papa rode twice to Mayfield. Amy went to the gardens before breakfast I, and Lizzie went afterwards for thistles for stems, roots and raspberries will call him Hop now. We all went swimming in the afternoon. Finished reading 'Bleak House' aloud yesterday. Kate waited up for Mark all the night, but he did not come at all, has four men at the fires too. Returned at dusk half a mile of fencing burnt. Harriet went down the beach alone.

4 TUESDAY [Feb 13] Wednesday

Cloudy - windy. Papa rode once to Mayfield. Amy went with me to the Middle Paddock before breakfast to bring Garry home and put him in the front field. Kate and I went for butter, and over to the Hop east to see Horrell about my saddle. Told Estelle to bring it home - saw old Bosque there. Mark set the net before going out to the fires. Harriet, Kate, & I went to look at it with him after tea, only found three fish though. They sailed away quickly. & pulled up to the boat house slowly. Amy sent us both post note from Mum & said they are back soon. Heard them on the beach.

5 WEDNESDAY [Feb 14] Thursday

Wool - W. wind. Papa, and I, rode up to the Cricket Match at Shawsbury, against Abora. after twelve o'clock dinner were delayed some time at Harefield sending men out to look at the fires. Mark was at Vicar Valley as we passed. Amy, & I, went to the Creek garden, led Garry for a swim. Lizzie went with us to get Hop some food. Walked on to the Cricket ground. Papa's horse was sent away. Mr Shaw took Garry to the fires for some time, then I rode alongside ~~abominations~~ to Epsom Banks.

6 TUESDAY (10-10)

Friday

Windy - getting ready for going to the
 Linville Falls came. Fred took up with me
 and Emily to Shaw's Bluff -
 Harriet and I went to church. Mark and Athelby started in
 the carriage but were obliged to abandon it
 early walk down to New Melton. There were 2000
 in the boat & the horses slogged afterwards in one
 of the first 3 or 4 miles of the paddocks. Papa stayed at
 Franklin. Mr. Mayson talked a good deal to us.
 The children were interested. Mr. Mayson unhesi-
 tatingly said he was looking towards Green Banks.

7 FRIDAY (10-10)

Saturday

Windy - Mark and Kate started for Linville
 first thing. Papa called afterwards but I am
 not going home yet. Mr. Mayson looked at the
 fire. Margaret, Emily, Harriet & I, drove to Red
 Banks for the baskets & they left where we dinnered
 at the Bluff yesterday. Saw Mr. Shaw, Mr. Solly,
 and Amis' friend's brother George Jones who came
 in the post cart to escort his sister home on
 Monday. Called for the post - up to church for
 the service. Miss Davis and Amy Shaw were there.
 Harriet, and I, walked back.

8 SATURDAY (10-10)

Sunday

Fine. Mr. Mayson started for Apsley enroute
 for the Marshall's after church. Margaret and Emily
 went to the Sunday School. Harriet and I, were
 rather late at church. Emily & I, went for a short
 walk round the paddock before tea. After dinner
 and I, went up on the public road saw Mark
 driving home after leaving Miss H. Jones, at Mr.
 H. J. Jones' also a valise of mine.

9 Monday

Fine. Harriet and I, went to see Mrs. Lewis.
 Went round Mr. Bullock's land in the afternoon. Margaret
 and Emily brought my valise from the Ironworks.

9 September 1873 SUNDAY (10-10)

Hop picking begun

10 MONDAY (11-224) Tuesday

Sun, cool breeze - Harriet, and I, bathed in the forenoon - went with Margaret, to see Mr. Apper and Mr. Pole. Then she went round by the shops, while we came straight back. Mr. Mayson is home again.

11 TUESDAY (12-322) Wednesday

Sun - Harriet, and I, bathed. Rode up to the Township in the afternoon, left Quarry to be shod while we went to the Library, Opera, Post and along the road for a short walk. Mr. George Moore has died suddenly, of Typhoid fever leaving three little children - Margaret and Emily went late to post a letter - the latter went to Mr. W. J. Sykes in the morning. We saw Fred and Amy Shrewsbury as they were starting for Leithill, enroute for Roberttown.

12 WEDNESDAY (12-322) Thursday

Strong sea breeze - Harriet and I bathed & altered our saddles. Afternoon rode along the road past Lambton, over the fence across the sands on to the beach round the Bluff, where I jumped the log, let Insipin over when he got away, but I galloped after & caught it again. Mary Heredita has come here to spend the winter - Mr. Mayson went to the Township. Ernest came for Mary.

They have begun hop picking at home.

13 THURSDAY [14-15] Friday

Walter withy wards - Harriet and I, bathed - Mr and Mrs Mayson drove to see the Germans - Then he drove to Red Banks - Harriet, and I, went opposite that place, walked over to Lambton to spend the evening. Played games till late, and were just going to bed when Mr Mayson, and Emily, came for us - Mr and Mrs Smiths were spending the evening there so they could not leave sooner.

Murphy was at the inquest held on Mr Kings burnt fence on regatta day - last Tuesday
Saw Mr Shaw, and Mr J. Talbot.

14 FRIDAY [15-16] Saturday

Close and warm - Harriet, and I, bathed - We rode back in the bush to see Mr Jacks - she pointed out the track up the small sugar loaf - we rode almost up, tied the horses till we had admired the view sufficiently, then came down this side - Mr Dev called here - After tea we rode on to hear him lecture at the Council Chambers - Our British Bible and how we got it - There were eleven to hear it. Margaret, and Emily, went to the practice, the last stayed for the lecture and came home with us - rode part way on Harriets horse.

15 SATURDAY [16-17] Sunday

Showers in the morning set in for said Sunday
Harriet went with her Papa to the Sunday School - Margaret, Emily, and I, went after a shower of rain, so were late in church.

16 Monday

Rained in the night till showers first thing -
Harriet, and I, walked along Kings beach - Mr Mayson went to see Mr Lewis Margaret, & Emily went to the Township. Harriet and I rode to the saddle, left our horses there while we mounted my saddle & went to the library - Emily broke the buckle, but pack's lost no one.

16 Tuesday [17-18] Spent the evening at the Grange with Mr & Miss Rose, till 8 o'clock when we got home.

17 MONDAY [18-217] Tuesday

Fine. Mr Mayson drove Harriet Emily and I opposite Mrs Dove; Emily walked on to Mrs Banks. Mr Mayson waited for us while we called for Miss Dove. Drove with her to Mrs Banks' and back to the Scrivenship when Emily got in. We walked up to the Manse to stay.

18 TUESDAY [19-218] Wednesday

Fine. We were going down to the Library to finish a story we were reading, when Miss Pope, Mr John, and Miss H. Steagley came up so we waited and went down with them. Mr East was all going to Lisselton in the afternoon. Miss Dove went along with us and to the Saddler, then on to see Mr Smith at the school, on to the Post Office then back. Miss Margaret Amos came to dinner. Mr and Mrs Barlow to tea.

19 WEDNESDAY [19-219] Thursday

Cloudy. I wind. Left the Manse about ten o'clock came down to Green Banks with Miss Dove. She and Harriet drove down to Kelvinton with me. Marsh came to meet me there. rode home in time for tea. Mr Rush followed his nephew Frank and here with sheep on their way to the sale. Mr & Miss H. Steagley have been out for a picnic at the Hop Ground today with the others.

20 THURSDAY [21-218] Friday

Cloudy. Wind. Mr. J. and T. Cotton left with their sheep. Mr. - Miss Stoughton went afterwards. Papa rode to Mayfield with them. He went again in the afternoon! We three walked to the Hop ground in the afternoon, got some peaches on our way. Mark has been putting up the Penny Farthing fence that was burnt.

21 FRIDAY [22-219] Saturday

Fine. Papa rode to the Hop ground & Point sun. Amy went to the Greek for congress. We three went for butter and picked a few hops. Mama has a slight attack on her chest. Mark had early breakfast, went out fencing at his place.

22 Sunday

Fine. Mark, Amy, and I went singly to the gardens. I ate went for mulberries and down on the beach. Sunday School and Church as usual.

-22 SATURDAY [23-220]

23 Monday

Warm. Mark has been busying. We went to the Hop ground, back very quickly in the afternoon. Papa rode there twice. Mark sent in another young hangeron.

-23 QUINQUAGESIMA SUNDAY [24-221]

24 MONDAY [30-310] + Tuesday

southly wind. Mark went hunting, got ten kangaroos and two wallaby. Papa rode to Mayfield was going round when he met Mr. Shaw driving Mr. Wright Shaw and Mr. Solly home returned with them. Mark set the net before breakfast. Amy and I picked the peaches in the orchard the outside of the creek were carrying them home when James Dodge passed, and so he put them in his cart & carried them down for us to the Granary.

25 Feb. TUESDAY [30-300]

Wednesday

Fine, I. breezy. Mr. Shaw drove Mr. J. Shaw away before dinner, the latter has to go away in the boat. Mr. Solly sketched the Schontau. walked to Mayfield after us - we three went on before for butter, picked some roses & a basket of peaches on our return. Mark got 25 fish before breakfast, has been burning.

26 Feb. WEDNESDAY [37-308]

Thursday

Fine, I. breezy. Papa rode twice to Mayfield and to Bonner's Creek - Mark Mr. Solly Kate and I, went out in the Nautilus across to Surfside beach, we could not get in to Little Swanport river. After lunch we took bank under a tree we rowed out to sea and tied the boat to help and fished only got two rock cod. Servants went to the shop picking -

27 THURSDAY [28-29]

Friday

Northwly wind - Papa, and Mr Solly rode twice to Mayfield. They went to Lover's Leap in the morning. The latter went again in the afternoon and took a sketch.

Mash has been burning Minshall's pew.

We were cooking in the morning - but went to the Hop ground in the afternoon.

Mr Solly took Kate, Amy & my silhouette.

28 FRIDAY

Saturday

W wind and shower. He joined at Mayfield lower hop around. Mr Shaw, drove Mr Walter, & Mr Joseph Shaw down to it, but they went back again - Kate and Amy above. Mr Solly, Papa, and I rode. Mash came there for dinner & wills us. Letter from Minnie -

1 March SATURDAY

Sunday

Fine. Kate, Mash, Amy, and I went for separate walk. Mr Mayson preached.

Monday

Fine. Mash went out early gathering. Papa rode twice to Mayfield. Mr Mayson went to see Mr Dodge at the Saltworks - Mr Solly tried to catch beans, but did not succeed. After dinner he drove away with Mr Mayson. We miss him very much, he is such a nice man. Kate has got me to take the housekeeping for this week. She & Amy went to see Mr Dodge, who is ill. I went twice to the gardens, morning & evening. Sophie with me in the evening -

28 SUNDAY

3 MONDAY (40-341)

Tuesday

Fine - Papa went to Bonne Creek, & Mayfield twice - Kate, Amy, and I went to the Hop picking - I took Lizzie to the gardens for vegetables in the morning. Amy drove Mama to the saltworks to see Mr. Dodge - Mama, and Jane after tea last night. She is better today. Marsh has had Pow at Mayfield about the sheep.

4 TUESDAY (40-342)

Wednesday

Cloudy, misty snow & show - Papa rode twice to Mayfield - Marsh had his breakfast early, the weather changed his mind, so he went out hunting - Amy helped me with the cooking in the morning - we all walked to the scrub Hop ground for the other one is picked.

Fine - Papa rode twice to Mayfield. He picniced at the top Hop ground, with Homer Wash and Charley Syne, who went away to Swansua after. Wash is going away for sheep. I rode the quarry, the other two above.

8 Monday

Sunday
Ban fine. I got some mulleries for desert. Went to Church and Sunday School.

9 Monday

Fine. Papa, and Kate, rode to Swansua and back. She has made him say we are not to have anything more to do with those horses so good bye to riding. Amy, and I, ~~walked~~ to Mayfield. Scrub Hop ground; back via the mill for a little wheat for the swans.

4 SUNDAY

10 MONDAY [10-11]

Tuesday

Fine. Papa rode to Mayfield, and and Horner Creek. Kate went to Barns and part way to Belottes. Amy, and I, went to Mayfield scrub hop around, and up round the paddocks to see the grass in the bushy banks.

11 TUESDAY [10-11]

Very fine. Papa went twice to Mayfield. Amy and I, went to Mr. Wm. Hingshalls for dinner. Have been busy cooking for the Hop Feast. The picking is finished today. Mark & Ben get the sheep the former takes some to the Point sun in the afternoon. Kate went out for a while.

25 TUESDAY (15-16)

Wednesday

Very fine. Hop Feast day about 150 people at it. Amy and I went up the Creek for ferns, for the table. Mr. W. J. Lyne, Fred Shaw came, but went after tea. Three Misses Mayson drove down. Clara Meredith, & Miss Davis rode. Mr. Lloyd who takes sketches of views in America for a work to be published. Mr. Shaw, and Mr. Lolly are here also. every-thing went off very well - How about G. W. Avery for our gastronomian.

26 WEDNESDAY (16-17)

Thursday

Been cloudy. Papa rode to Mayfield Mr. Shaw, and Mr. P. Lloyd left in the morning. Three Misses Mayson, and Clara Meredith, went away after dinner. Amy and I, took them and Miss Benton & Miss Davis, down on the beach before dinner. Mark and Mr. Lolly went shooting in the forenoon.

27 THURSDAY

Friday
