



to the Cattle Payed for Private Sale by the Butcher  
in the Town I pay to the Gov<sup>t</sup> One Shilling & Sixpence  
for <sup>the</sup> - for the Wear and Tear of the Necessary Articles  
required for the same - and Two Shillings and Two Pence  
for <sup>the</sup> I pay and Divide amongst Six Men employed  
as Butchers - out of which they have to pay for  
their Knives & Peel the Brooms for Cleansing the  
Caughter House, Fiches for Catching the Cattle - Fire  
for cooking their Victuals and Extra Clothing nothing of  
the same accruing to me - The same was by L<sup>td</sup> Gov<sup>t</sup> Councils  
orders to me when I took Charge of the Caughter House  
on 1<sup>st</sup> Nov<sup>r</sup> - 1828 .. as it was his Wish to remove the  
Caughter<sup>ing</sup> of the Cattle from the different yards of  
the Butchers in Town - as such I volunteered my Service  
to Induce them to bring their Cattle to Gov<sup>t</sup> Caughter  
House - where the Expence was left to them and more  
Attention paid to their Interest - and it has at the  
same time remunerated the Gov<sup>t</sup> for all Expences  
I incurred - which was my principal Motive for  
Undertaking what was not required of me - as I had  
only to Caughter what might be called for for the Supplies  
of the Gov<sup>t</sup> - I have therefore stated by what Authority

I Receive and Dem and the Fees & Dues which I pay to the  
Govt with the respect<sup>ts</sup> ~~to~~ <sup>to</sup> you have request<sup>d</sup> if you  
will be kind enough to furnish me with a copy of <sup>the</sup> same  
being unacquainted with the Form or Manner required  
I should feel greatly obliged - and furnish the same  
as early as I possibly can - being seldom at home from  
Day light until the Evening - I Remain Sir
